

UPDATE FROM SESSION CONCERNING MASKS FOR VACCINATED AND UNVACCINATED PEOPLE IN WORSHIP.





WE LOVE TO TELL THE STORY — This Sunday, July 18, Pastor Scott invites us to listen to a modern telling of the story of Peter’s denial of Jesus using the Gospel of Luke account. He originally wrote this story during the height of the HIV-AIDS Crisis while serving as an Associate Minister at Northminster Presbyterian Church in Indianapolis (1988-1994). A colleague in ministry, Rev. Howard Warren, was fired by the church he served when they found out he had contracted the HIV-AIDS virus. Ryan White, a young high school student from Kokomo, Indiana, had a blood disease known as hemophilia. He contracted the HIV-Virus following a blood transfusion. His high school would not allow him to attend in person, so he transferred to Hamilton Heights High School in Cicero,

Indiana. Ryan White died one month short of his high school graduation; his funeral was held at Second Presbyterian Church in Indianapolis. During this time, Magic Johnson, star NBA player for the Los Angeles Lakers announced he too had contracted the HIV-Virus. This story takes place on a basketball court where two friends often came to shoot hoops and talk. It is a story of denial, rejection, and ultimately, redemption.
