*One:* I come to you as one of your many children; I am weak I am small I need your wisdom and your strength. Let me walk in beauty, and make my eyes ever behold the red and purple sunsets.

**Many: Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me.**

*One:* Make my hands respect the things you have made, and make my ears sharp so I may hear your voice. Make me wise, so that I may understand what you have taught my people and The lessons you have hidden in each leaf and each rock.

**Many:** **You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows.**

*One:* We turn our thoughts to all of the Fish life in the water. They were instructed to cleanse and purify the water. They also give themselves to us as food. We are grateful that they continue to do their duties and we send to the Fish our greetings and our thanks.

**Many:** **Now our minds are one.**

*One:* Now we turn toward the vast fields of Plant life. As far as the eye can see, the Plants grow, working many wonders. They sustain many life forms. With our minds gathered

together, we give thanks and look forward to seeing Plant life for many generations to come.

**Many: Now our minds are one.**

*One:* When we look about us, we see that the berries are still here, providing us with delicious foods. The leader of the berries is the strawberry, the first to ripen in the spring.

Can we agree that we are grateful that the berries are with us in the world and send our thanksgiving, love, and respect to the berries?

**Many: Now our minds are one.**

*One:* With one mind, we honor and thank all the Food Plants we harvest from the garden, especially the Three Sisters who feed the people with such abundance. Since the beginning of time, the grains, vegetables, beans, and fruit have helped the people survive.

Many other living things draw strength from them as well. We gather together in our minds all the plant foods and send them a greeting and thanks.

Each morning they greet the day and with their songs remind us to enjoy and appreciate life. The Eagle was chosen to be their leader and to watch over the world. To all the Birds, from the smallest to the largest, we send our joyful greetings and thanks.
